

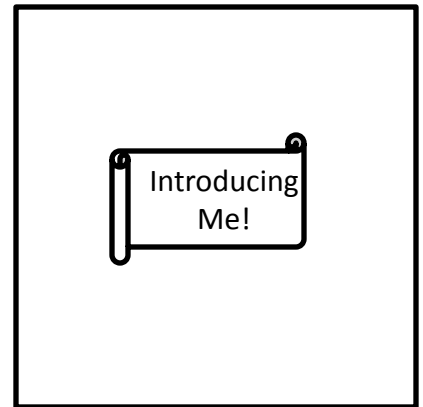
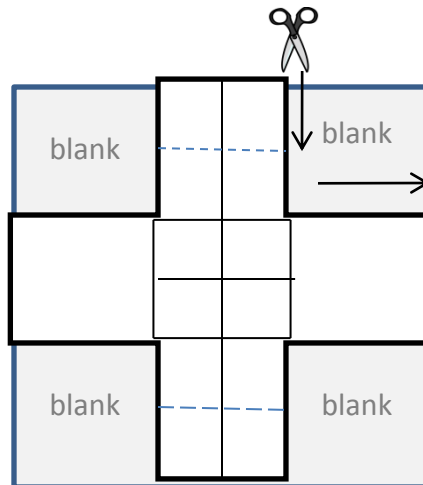
Introducing Me Booklet

Materials: a single piece of white paper or a double sided printout of the template provided, scissors

Instructions:

1. Fill in template or squares
2. Cut out the blank squares (shape will resemble a plus sign)
3. Fold top 2 rectangles down
4. Fold bottom 2 rectangles up
5. Fold square on right side to the left
6. Fold square on the left to the right

This simple booklet is a great way for students to share things about themselves and get to know each other. As an AQ teacher I often use ME books to help me get to know my students and find out what their expectations are about the course I am teaching. You can do these books in many ways. I have provided a sample with questions and answers to help students see what a well done booklet is like. This is the second ME booklet I have used and this one includes a centre portion that allows students to ask and answer questions using who, what, where, and when. By giving sentences with blanks to be filled in, you can make this project accessible to ELLs in the early stages. For more advanced students you can give them the option of filling in each area with their own creative ideas.

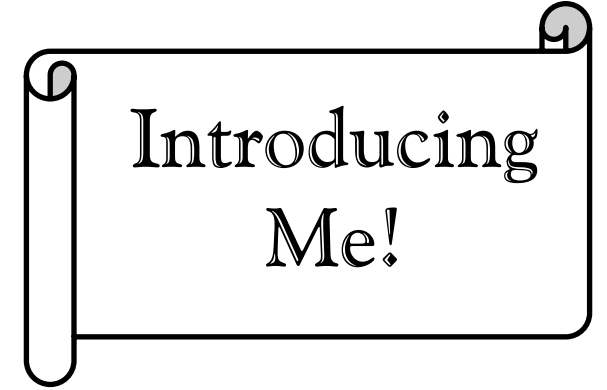

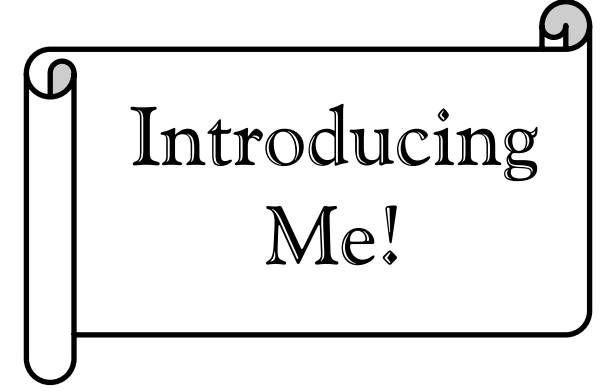
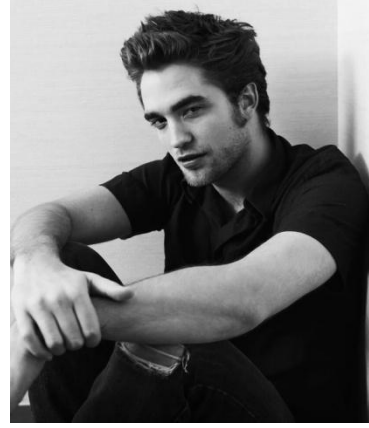
